LITERACY :

1. The 'Which Word' worksheet is simply a draw a line from the picture to the correct word. The children then need to write the first letter which is common to the three words. They can colour the pictures if there is time. There are a number of similar worksheets in the pre-school section of Literacy.
2. The 'My First Sentence' worksheets is about introducing children to the sentence structure. Cut out the words on the first page and get the children to put them in the correct order. They can write the sentence on the second page. There are more similar sheets in the pre-school Literacy section of the site.
3. The reading activity has three very simple sentences. You could cut the sentences up and ask the children to either stick them down into their book in sentences that make sense or more able children could write them out. Again, more able ones could write a new sentence.

NUMERACY:

1. There are ten pages of activities for counting up to ten.
2. If you want to focus in on a specific number then the worksheets 'What is 7?' looks at the number seven with the children colouring seven objects and partitioning seven into the pairs that make seven.

PM

1. PSHE - You can either start or end the day with the PSHE story, allow about 20 minutes for the story and follow-up discussions. The story , 'The Bumble Bee' is about respecting nature.
2. There are two science sheets, one looking at man made things and the other one distinguishing between living and non-living things.. They can colour the sheets when they are finished.
3. For art they could split their page in half and on one half draw something that is alive and on the other they can draw something that has never been alive.
