LITERACY :

1. The sentence builder activity could be completed on the board as a class lesson and if you wanted to take up more time then get the children to write the sentences on the sheets or into an exercise book.
2. Phonics - children often confuse **ir** and **ur** and these worksheets look at where these letters occur. The first two have easy words and the next two are harder so you can give pages 3 and 4 to more able children.
3. The writing worksheets give the less able a structure to their work. The more able can create their own sentences about a trip to the beach onto the second page without doing the first page.

NUMERACY:

1. The treasure chest worksheet can be a good starter for the lesson and could be copied onto the board as a class activity.
2. The Calendar worksheets are good revision on basic knowledge that all children should know but often forget !
3. The Pyramid worksheets will help the children understand about the characteristics of 3D shapes, such as edges, faces, etc.

PM

1. PSHE - You can either start or end the day with the PSHE story, allow about 20 minutes for the story and follow-up discussions.
2. SCIENCE : The Butterfly/Frog quiz is great fun. Organise the children into pairs for this exercise and they must sort all the characteristics of the two creatures. They then can finish the last sheet about sequencing the life cycles of butterflies and frogs.
3. ART : Butterflies have symmetrical wing patterns. Get the children to draw the shape of a butterfly then colour it in a symmetrical way.
